

E.I. du Pont de Nemours and Company Disclosure of Corporate Political Expenditures
November 6, 2009

Background

DuPont business operations are directly impacted by extensive federal regulations in the environmental, tax and trade areas, and by increasingly active state government actions. In this environment, it is essential for DuPont to be involved in the political process by making prudent political contributions that are consistent with its business objectives and in compliance with all federal, state and local laws. As a result of reforms to federal campaign finance laws, DuPont corporate contributions to federal candidates are prohibited. Since the mid 1980's, DuPont has sponsored a Political Action Committee—the DuPont Good Government Fund (DGGF). DGGF's activities are authorized by federal law which allows DuPont to solicit funds from eligible employees for the purpose of providing financial support to political candidates. The DGGF files quarterly reports with the Federal Election Committee to show the source of the funds received and how they were expended, all of which is readily available for public inspection.

Procedures

DGGF is managed by the Government Affairs Advisory Council (GAAC) which has the responsibility to review and approve all DGGF political contributions. GAAC members represent a cross-section of business interests and include several members of DuPont executive management leadership team.

DuPont corporate contributions, which are legally permitted only on the state and local levels, are also managed by the GAAC. Both corporate and PAC contributions are made to candidates who have demonstrated a positive concern for issues that are important to the businesses and markets in which the Company operates, and are based on the following criteria, among others:

- The candidates demonstrated honesty, integrity, effectiveness, and commitment to good governance;
- The candidates' understanding and support for issues important to DuPont and its employees;
- The location of DuPont employees and/or facilities in the candidates' state or district;
- The candidates' position in leadership or in key committees, or the candidates' potential for leadership;
- The candidates' financial need and chance of being elected; and
- The alignment of the candidates' voting record with DuPont's values and positions.

January 1, 2009 to October 31, 2009 Direct Political Corporate Contributions and Expenditures

The information which follows in this report identifies the recipients of political contributions or expendituresⁱ made by DuPont during the period beginning January 1, 2009 and ending October 31, 2009ⁱⁱ, the amount contributed to each recipient and the date on which it was made.

ⁱ For the purposes of this report, the term “political contributions and expenditures” includes all payments made to (i) individual candidates, (ii) party committees; (iii) Political Action Committees (“PACs”); (iii) Leadership PACs; (iv) ballot issue groups (state or federal); or (v) any 527 organizations. It also refers to independent expenditures that expressly advocate a candidate's election or defeat, or payments that have to be reported as electioneering communications under federal or state campaign finance law. This term does *not* apply to money spent on lobbying or to charitable donations.

ⁱⁱ This disclosure covers political contributions and expenditures for January 1, 2009 to October 31, 2009. Thereafter, DuPont will make every effort to post the specified information on its website semi-annually covering the periods ending June 30 and December 31.

ⁱⁱⁱ This provision applies to only the trade associations, classified as such for purposes of the tax rules at section 501(c)(6), receiving payments in excess of \$25,000 per year. This information is collected once yearly and reflects expenditures for the previous year.
